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BASIC FACTS ABOUT THE FAMILY EVICTION PREVENTION SUPPLEMENT (FEPS) PROGRAM

What are the eligibility requirements for FEPS?

- There must be a parent or caretaker relative who is a recipient of Public Assistance (PA) or child recipient under the age of 18 years old or under 19 and attending high school full time. The subsidy is only for recipients.
- 2. You must have a current eviction court case where rent above the regular shelter allowance is owed, OR there is no current court case but you need the FEPS approval in order to move to a new apartment because there is a current vacate order, a current foreclosure or you were evicted in the last year for excess rent.
- 3. When the apartment is not rent regulated, the person applying for FEPS must be the tenant of record and have an agreement in writing with her landlord to stay at least one year.
- 4. Everyone in your home who is eligible for PA must receive PA or have a verified income. Persons not in receipt of PA must pay at least 30% of their income or at least a pro rata share of the ongoing rent and often the arrears.
- 5. Normally, you must owe no more than \$7,000. (Stale checks or missing regular shelter checks will not count towards this \$7,000 limit.)
- 6. You must have no other funds to pay the back rent.

Will I get FEPS if I am sanctioned?

7. No FEPS supplement or rent arrears will be issued for a period when a PA recipient is currently sanctioned. PA will not pay the sanctioned person's share of the back rent.

How much does FEPS pay each month

8. It depends on who is in your home and what income you and they have. Each case is different. If you have income budgeted from your PA you will get less than the maximums:

Is there an absolute maximum rent limit (cap)?

9. Yes, the maximum rent that can be charged based on the total number of people (regardless of whether on PA or not) in the household is:

^{**} These providers will process a move to a new apartment if you were sued and were evicted or sued and left your home and qualified for FEPS at the time and qualify for FEPS now. If you are in shelter you must find a new apartment and have the FEPS processed within 6 months from becoming homeless or within 12 months if you are doubled up.

All changes must be reported immediately to these providers except moves must be approved first. 11/15/11

^{**}These providers will also see you if your FEPS needs to be modified or restored due to a change in household income, a change in people living in your home, your FEPS dropped off in the last year, you need to move due to a health and safety reason or need to move to a less expensive apartment.
